Pattern: Designs to Share with You Pieced Placemats

You can pick this up when you come to the first class or when you sign up for the class.

Sewing Machine and Machine Feet

- Standard Sewing foot
- Piecing Foot ($\frac{1}{4}$ " foot)
- Stitch in the Ditch Foot or Edge Joining Foot
- Even Feet Foot (Walking Foot)

Rotary Cutting Tools

- 6.5" x 24" Rotary Ruler
- Elan 35" Cutting Mat
- Olfa 45mm Rotary Cutter
- O'lipfa 15.5" Square Rotary Ruler

Sewing Tools

- 5" scissors
- Point Turner
- Sewing Awl
- Seam Gauge

Notions

- Miter Binding Tool
- Needles for piecing: 80/12 universal needles
- Needles for quilting: 90/14 quilting needles
- Water Soluble Marking Pen

- KK2000 temporary spray adhesive
- Glass head pins
- Teflon pressing sheet

Thread

- For Piecing: Mettler Silk Finish Cotton in a neutral color that lends with your fabric. Usually a shade of white, gray, brown or taupe.
- For Quilting: Will be discussed in class.

Fabric for Four Placemats

- Purchase high quality quilting weight cotton.
 - Do not purchase fabrics with one-way designs.
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- Feature Fabric: 1 yard (floral fabric in the photo)
 - Light Coordinate Fabric: ½ yard
 - Dark Coordinate Fabric: 2 yards (must be at least 42" wide)
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- Batting: I will have a yard of fusible batting ready for you to purchase on the first day of class.

Prior to the First Class

Starch & Press Fabric

Do not prewash fabric unless it is red or black.

1. Protect a flat surface with plastic.
2. Lay fabric on the flat surface.
3. Spray fabric thoroughly with diluted liquid spray starch. (StayFlo or Faultless Concentrated Starch is available at grocery stores. Mix 1 part starch with 3 parts water in a spray bottle. Shake to mix.)
4. Let the fabric dry flat. If you hang it to dry, it will become distorted.
5. When fabric is dry, press with a steam iron set on cotton.

<p style="text-align: center;">Press. Do Not Iron Press with a press and lift action. Do not slide the iron across the fabric as this may stretch the fabric.</p>
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
